Mentorship


Longer term strategic advice presented for consideration and guidance in a broader range of issues such as leadership, employer/employee coaching, etc.

Accion Opportunity Fund Provides loans, educational resources, coaching, and support networks.




City of Lockhart's Economic Development Corporation has developed a list of all Federal, State, and Local tax incentives. Each one is described in detail and how to apply if you qualify.
